The opera, Lost Childhood, is based on child Holocaust survivor and psychiatrist Yehuda Nir's memoir, The Lost Childhood, and on Nir's friendship with Gottfried Wagner (great-grandson of Richard Wagner), a specialist in post-Holocaust dialogue between victims, perpetrators and their descendants. The two main characters of the opera are inspired by these two men. The opera recollects the terrors of the Holocaust but inspires a hopeful vision of the future.
